

## Cleaning and Caring for your SS Milk Bottle

The Stainless Steel bottles are relatively easy to care for:



- Wash in hot water using just a little drop of detergent.
- You **can** give stainless steel a **good scrub with a clean plastic dish brush** (it is a good idea to keep a separate one to the one you use for your other dishes)
- You **can** put your **SS Bottle** in the dishwasher but **NOT** the **lid.**
- Make sure to **thoroughly** clean the lid especially around the seal; it is a good idea to **remove the seal** (*I use the handle of a small teaspoon to remove it*) and clean it properly at least once per month with a clean dish brush; more often if the bottle is kept on it's side. **DO NOT** put the lid in the dishwasher as the high pressure jets will push water inside the plastic and it is then extremely hard to remove.
- A **clean** tea towel should be used to dry both bottle and lid.
- Baking soda and warm water can also be used to cleanse and freshen your bottle.
- The SS Bottles can also be sterilised with boiling water.
- **DO NOT** place in the SS Bottle in the freezer or use bleach to clean the bottles as it will stain and corrode the stainless steel.
- After sterilising, the bottles **can** be put in the oven on a **low heat** to dry.
- **Do** leave in the sun for a couple of hours if possible as the UV rays kill all bacteria.
- Loosely fit lid so bottle can breathe until reused.
